On November 30th the PULCHRA project held a successful second workshop. The aim of the workshop was to provide an opportunity for schools to share their experiences with PULCHRA City Challenges and present their results. 100 participants representing 14 different countries attended the event!

Participants were interested to hear from keynote speaker, Alise Olesika, from the National Commission, Latvia, UNESCO followed by a session on Open Schooling and science grounded in students' inquiry with presenters from the University of **TEREZA** Educational Athens and Centre. Participants also learned how to remote sensing tools to understand urban sustainability challenges presented by Přemysl Štych and Josef Laštovička from Charles University.

Marie Drahoňovská, journalist author of the PULCHRA Handbook of a Young Reporter, shared information on how to communicate on school-based activities, an invaluable session for the Science Reporters in the audience!

Participants listened to 13 inspirational school presentations with rich examples οf how local stakeholders were engaged in solving city sustainability challenges across the EU.

The workshop also opened a field for discussion on opportunities and barriers of Open Schooling, engagement projects and **stakeholders** in school provided an opportunity for international networking
